They held the book launch at the Monumental Church, which is built on the site of the Richmond Theater that burned to the ground in 1811. Rachel's novel follows the lives of 4 people who were in the theater at the time of the fire. I've already read my copy! Rachel's husband is a VCU math professor. She said when they were considering moving to Richmond and he came for his interview for the job, they were driving down Broad Street in a taxi. She noticed the church and asked about it. The taxi driver gave her his abbreviated version about the theater fire and how the church was built as a memorial to those lost in the fire. She said that little nugget remained in her mind for years and when she was ready to write her second book, that was the event she wanted to write about. So many stories to tell--that's how our writer brains work!

As I told you in my last newsletter, I had my first book signing on April 15th at a bookstore in Mechanicsville, VA called Books, Beads & More. It's a charming little indie bookstore that sells used books, local crafts and has a whole section devoted to local authors. I sold and signed both books. A couple of my friends from James River Greyhounds set up a greyhound meet-n-greet on the same afternoon. I sold a few books, and we got one greyhound adopted so I'm counting that as a success! 
## THE NINETEENTH OF APRIL
